



Red Gulch Dinosaur Tracksite: Greybull

Take a walk with the dinosaurs. The Red Gulch Dinosaur Tracksite is the largest tracksite in Wyoming and one of only a few worldwide from the Middle Jurassic Period. There are hundreds of tracks at this site, where dinosaurs once walked along the ocean shoreline 167 million years ago looking for something to eat. The site contains a boardwalk, interpretive signs, picnic tables, benches, trails and a graveled parking lot that can accommodate buses. Located on US Highway 14, approximately eight miles east of Greybull, Wyoming. www.blm.gov/visit/red-gulch

Historic Atlantic City: Mercantile

This incredible town transports you back to the 1800s, when the West was wild and hard work was fueled by aspirations of a better life. Near South Pass City, this booming mining town enjoyed short-lived prosperity starting in the late 1860s. Atlantic City had nearly 2,000 miners, many of whom were vacationers or part-time prospectors looking to score gold, so the town had many options for leisure and entertainment. During its heyday, the town reportedly had a brewery, dance hall and opera house. Currently, many original log homes and structures still remain, including a church and general store. Be sure to stop by the Atlantic City Mercantile, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, to grab a drink and a bite to eat. <https://travelwyoming.com/listing/lander/atlantic-city-mercantile>

Evanston: History & Culture

Located in the heart of downtown Evanston, the square is comprised of several historically significant structures, open spaces, gardens and recreational areas. The dominant buildings include the 1900 train depot, the Andrew Carnegie Library (now the Chamber of Commerce and Uinta County Museum), the Beeman Cashin and the Joss House (Chinese heritage) Museum. Depot Square is also home to Martin Park Heritage Gazebo, the Wing Family Chinese Gazebo, Amphitheater & Garden, Columbo Hall railroad building, an original Lincoln Highway marker, a basketball court, an open green space, an English telephone booth, water fountain, a 9/11 memorial and a statue of "Albert the Bison". www.TravelWyoming.com/Cities/Evanston

Cheyenne Frontier Days: Returning in 2021

Since 1897, the rough-and-tumble town of Cheyenne, Wyoming has honored its heritage with a Western show that's grown to become Cheyenne Frontier Days. The bucket list-worthy, 10-day celebration features professional rodeo events, A-list country music acts, spectacular parades and, of course, pancakes (as in, 100,000 pancakes). Today, the event draws visitors from all over the United States and more than 50 countries. Electrifying rodeo events such as bull riding and barrel racing wow audiences during the festival, so you'll have plenty of opportunities to get in on some of the action. As host of the world's largest outdoor rodeo, Cheyenne Frontier Days earns its reputation as the "Daddy of 'Em All," drawing some of the biggest names in the sport for a shot at more than \$1 million in cash and prizes (a sizable step up from the \$25 purse winning cowboys received early on). Other daily entertainment includes the amazing pancake breakfast, parade, carnival, visit to the Native American Village, witnessing the Chuck Wagon Cook-off, shopping, and more. Cheyenne Frontier Days will be celebrating its 125th anniversary in 2021, and it is sure to be one of the best with some world class acts hoping to get a spot on the big stage. <https://www.cfdrodeo.com/>

English Tunnel-South Pass City State Historic Site

Follow in the footsteps of a miner from 1868 and explore the English Tunnel. The English Tunnel is an adit cut into the living rock in 1868 and abandoned for over 150 years. South Pass City State Historic Site has restored the tunnel and opened it for tours. The tunnel, named for its English financial backers, is one of the state's earliest mining features. Visitors will find traces left by the mine workers, like the candles they used to light the tunnel. The South Pass City State Historic Site includes the Carissa Mine and 29 original town buildings people can tour. But it's more than a historic town and mine. Black Tooth Brewery: Cheyenne

With a humble beginning starting in Sheridan, Wyoming in November of 2010, Black Tooth opened its Taproom doors and brewery with only a 10 BBL brewhouse. This small beginning for Black Tooth quickly led to future expansions, and in the spring of 2015 the completion of a multi-million dollar production facility capable of producing upwards of 50,000 BBLs a year.

To Wyomingites' excitement, Black Tooth Brewery opened more brewery doors, this time in the capital city of Cheyenne, Wyoming on May 15th, 2020. The vision of being a leader in creating quality craft beer in the Rocky Mountain region has further become a reality. Black Tooth has three of its flagship beers, Saddle Bronc (Brown Ale), Bomber Mountain (Amber Ale) and Hot Streak (IPA) as well as multiple seasonal offerings including Copper Mule (Ginger/Lime Cream Ale) and Tour Bus (Passion Fruit/Blood Orange Summer Ale) available in 6-Pack cans and draught statewide in Wyoming.

Within the taproom doors you will find a relaxing yet vivacious tasting room where locals and travelers alike can enjoy a fresh pint, from a wide range of Black Tooth brews. So if you're passing through the wild states of the west make sure you stop into the new Cheyenne brewery or grab yourself a 6-pack or pint at a local watering hole.

Quebec 01 Missile Alert Facility Historic Site

Located up I-25 N is our next stop, the Quebec 01 Missile Alert Facility. The Quebec 01 Missile Alert Facility has been transferred over to the State of Wyoming to be operated as a State Historic Site thanks to the National Defense Authorization Act that was signed by President Donald Trump in December 2017 and the efforts of F. E. Warren Air Force Base. This site is significant as the only accessible Peacekeeper Missile Alert Facility left in the world and will strive to preserve and interpret the Cold War history of the late twentieth and early twenty-first centuries, fostering an understanding of the mission and duties of the personnel and crews assigned to work there. It was built to be hidden in plain sight and its virtual tour offers a photo walk through and 360 views.

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
